Dear Tony,

I want to thank you very much for the letter you sent us recently and to let you know that we appreciated it greatly. It means a lot to us to receive letters of encouragement and to be assured of your continued growth in the Lord. He is special - isn't He!

I think you know that I consider you, not only a brother in Christ, but also a dear friend and that that friendship will last, wherever we find ourselves and whatever happens. I understand that you find it difficult to trust people after all that has gone before, and I want you to know that, as a friend and brother, I will stick by you through whatever situation.

On Sunday night, an American friend from the assembly here who is going back to the States with his family for about 9 months, said: "We'll meet again here, there, or in the air (1Thess 4:17)." I thought that was good.

Today, I have been preparing for the Bible Study tonight with the assembly. They have asked me to speak and I feel the Lord has put a message on my heart "Look with God's eyes (John 4:35) - Love with God's heart (John 3:16) - and Go with God's power (MATT 28:18-20)." I feel burdened about the many millions on earth who have never been warned of their eternal destination and feel that if I and others could be a bit more Godly in our "eyesight" and love, we could reach more people with the gospel of Christ.

We are so thankful for your prayer for us, and we know it has a great bearing on our service for the Lord. Thanks also for the love you show in praying for Samuel as well. We find it hard sometimes to know what to pray and find ourselves just throwing ourselves at God's mercy and being thankful for the many believers in many countries who are praying for him.

Dear Tony,

This is just a quick note from N.Ireland! Sorry again that I didn't see you in Lincoln but I was praying for you and I hope all went well. I hope also that you got the books my wife Elizabeth took down to the police station. I will be returning on the 15th - Saturday and will be up to see you in Nicosia on the 20th - Thursday.

It has been a tough time for my family as they try and cope with the trauma of my brother having got cancer. He is 44 and has 3 children aged 16, 14, and 11. It is tough for his wife Isabel too. Please pray for them that the Lord will heal Samuel and that He will give strength to Isabel, her children, and my mother especially. They are all believers and that is tremendous because they know that everything is in God's hands.

How is it going in your New life. I am praying for you that the Lord will give you the strength to stand up for Him and that He will also help you to sort out those things in your life that don't bring Him glory. Isn't it amazing that when He takes over our lives, we have His desire to please Him rather than ourselves. I was reading His morning in John chapter 13. How Jesus got on His knees, took the servant's/slave's position and washed His disciples' feet - even Judas' and Peter's feet, while knowing that they were going to betray and deny Him - isn't He wonderful!

After all, we are one family in our loving Father through his begotten Son's precious blood. We want you to know that the doors are open wide for you and you are dearly welcome anytime.

If you will be released on the 11th of Nov. it's about 2 weeks from now. I wish we could be in England, that way, we could open our home to you. but that's quite impossible. We trust the Lord Jesus for the Christian family who will welcome you into their home is arranged by the loving Lord himself. Believe me I do understand how you feel about it. but please don't be shy. Our good Shepherd will lead you all the way. I also know that you will be a blessing to the ^{kind}family over there. And surely you will have our prayer support always!

The Lord said to me, "... being knit together in love," Colossians 2:2. (KJV) Please see also I John 4:7-21.



Tony, please don't be apologetic about your prayer on the day of our visit. It was wonderful prayer and we were blessed to be there and for your fellowship which was centered with our wonderful Lord was just great. I think you are perfectionist! Am I right? I am sure your art work is splendid indeed. The beautiful clock in our living room convinced me to believe that. May the Lord be glorified with your life.

Regarding your letter, you said, Ian and I could have done something more enjoyable and more creative during Ian's school holiday rather than coming to the prison to visit you. Well, you are absolutely wrong about that. As a matter of fact, we regretted not having come sooner to visit you. Our hearts were filled with joy and gladness and same time, our hearts just went out to you. Remember Brother Tony, when the loving Lord found one lost sheep, "he layeth it on his shoulders, rejoicing." And how He loved us dearly and keeps us now. So lets keep on praising Him in everything!

Tony, I appreciate very much for your prayers and specially you are praying for Roger's salvation. Roger is dead under his religion (Roman Catholic), just refuse to hear the wonderful mercy and sweet grace of the Lord Jesus. Just like many people, seeking for the freedom of immorality and walking according to the course of this world. Most people want to be free from everything! Can they be really free from the sight of God?

He mocks Ian if he can't be satisfied by mocking me only. But we praise the Lord we are able to come to the chapel and grow in the Lord. We want to be a good testimony to Roger for our wonderful Lord and bear the fruit of Spirit. I see myself a such failure but the Lord is good and merciful. I can lay down all to him at the foot of His cross. He cleanses all my sins and unrighteousness with His precious blood ever faithfully.

I know you are praying for us without ceasing. Thank you very much for your thoughtfulness and kindness.


We do not know until when we will be here.
